RAIN CAN'T DAMPEN RUNNERS AT 4TH ANNUAL WHITEROCK ULTRA

Heavy rain a day earlier did not discourage the participants in this year's Whiterock Ultra, reported Co-Director Greg Gayman of Grimes. Nearly three inches of rain fell in the Whiterock Conservancy area last Thursday and Friday, threatening to cancel the 50 Mile and 50 Kilometer races. In the end, the races were held and turned out to be a great energizing event.

"We ended up switching the course a little bit. I think it was the right thing to do," explained Gayman. "We kept runners off the single track trails so there was no damage to the trails but runners were still able to use large portions of the trails. It was a great race and everybody came in happy."

Gayman said temperatures stayed relatively cool on Saturday morning, with some fast times and lots of smiles. And the rain brought another feature that had been missing in previous years.

"We had a lot of water crossings for people this year," Gayman said, referencing the swollen creeks that channeled the rain water to the Middle Raccoon River.

There were 121 registered runners in the races, split evenly between the 50M and 50K races. There were runners from lowa, and also from Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, Wisconsin and Illinois. There were four runners from California, two from Georgia and one from both Arkansas and Virginia.

"The race keeps growing

here. They love Whiterock and the town of Coon Rapids," the co-director added.

Gayman, along with co-director Michael McGinn of Johnson, divided each race into three legs that started and ended at Whiterock Conservancy's river campgrounds. The third leg of each race led into the city of Coon Rapids via the Town

Loop Trail. That leg went west down Main Street past Frohlich's Super Valu, which once again was designated as a first aid station. Race organizers had prepaid a charge account so runners could 'charge' sports drinks, ice cream treats and popsicles.
